

# All ITONF Steering Committees have Terms of Reference

#### 1. MISSION

To lead the international thoracic oncology nursing community with a united expert voice, to deliver contemporary, strategic and meaningful education, research-related, and advocacy professional development opportunities, to facilitate evidence-based optimal nursing care for people living with thoracic malignancies.

#### 2. FUNCTION

A quadrennial Strategic Plan informs an annual priorities Workplan. The Workplan aims to ensure the timely and successful delivery of education, research-related, and advocacy professional development activities. The Strategic Plan and Workplan are determined by regular strategic planning under the imprimatur of the Committee.

#### 3. RESPONSIBILITIES

The Committee provides leadership, mentorship, education and expert level advice on a variety of issues and activities to the broader ITONF membership, at strategic scientific and social fora, and to the public. At times, the Committee may be called upon to provide input on specific issues or activities, for example, policy development or the release of new or updated clinical practice guidelines.



### **Strategic Plan for 2023-2026**


- Development of the Research section of the <u>www.itonf.com</u> website.
